Decision Record

- 1. The meeting was convened at 5:55 PM.
- 2. Our 2018 green fee, cart rental, and membership rates are attached after the Greenskeeper's Report.
- 3. The accountant will provide a year-end financial statement before the Spring general meeting (Wednesday 25 April at 7 PM).
- 4. The number of new members of all categories so far is 37 (including last year's Fall special). The loss to date is 15; net gain 22.
- 5. The Board approved the installation of a Point-of-Sale (POS) system for the kitchen. The cost will be \$5,200 + \$500 for individual cards to be issued to each member, with the \$150 food credit on it. The cost for the food "funny money" is about \$1000 per year, so the payback period is about 6 years. Each card is not a credit card; it will be pre-loaded with the \$150 food money prior to being issued (tips can be included if desired). When that pre-load runs

out, the option to add an additional amount to the card will be available.

- 6. The Board is looking into the options for constructing permanent toilet facilities (one site for each nine). This project is in the planning stage. The financial impact on the Capital Plan is not yet known.
- 7. Our participation in the annual Ottawa Golf Show at the EY Centre was a success. Given that many people engaged the booth volunteers with questions about where we were and their ability to book green fees, the goal of increasing our visibility was achieved. We also had a multitude of people submit their e-mail addresses for a chance to win one annual membership (Judy Snider was the winner; both she and the other contestants have received an e-mail to this effect). Three new members even signed up at the show.
- 8. A review of the course rating will be done by Golf Canada this year. It is totally within our purview to change the stroke hole ratings (the range of most to least difficult) and an initiative to do so for the men's tees is underway, based upon a data set of the previous year's scores for each hole.
- 9. A 2018 version of the Membership Guide is now posted on the web site.
- 10. The Board voted to upgrade to a commercial grade internet router, with a view to having greater stability. We will concurrently have installed a commercial Uninterruptible Power Supply (UPS) with auto reset, rack-mounted network video cameras with onsite data storage, a direct-wire electrical access point, and 3 hard-wired cameras one pan & zoom unit at the first tee, one for the golf cart storage area, and one for the parking lot. The total cost, including installation, will be \$5,475. Additional security cameras

will be considered once we have some experience with the first installations.

- 11. The Spring General Meeting will be held on Wednesday 25 April 2018 at 7 PM. There will be 2 agenda items:
 - A financial update (a reminder that the latest financial statement will be posted on the web site before this meeting (under Board of Directors)); and
 - A vote to approve amendments to the Bylaws (a 2/3 majority will be required). An information paper on this issue will be included with a meeting notice that will be sent out next week.
- 12. The current estimate for the completion of the new irrigation system remains the end of May 2018.
- 13. The meeting adjourned at 08:00 PM.
- 14. The next Board meeting will be on Thursday 19 April 2018 at Myers at 6 PM.

All machinery and golf carts have had their winter maintenance completed. Some tree trimming has been done along the river on hole 18. We started removing tarps on 27 March; more will be done as

they become clear of ice. We will be starting to do irrigation work around the covered bridge area within the next two weeks, then around the club house, putting green area, chipping green area, 18 green and approach, and 10 tee.

We had our supervisor training for health and safety at the Hunt club on 16 March; four of us attended. Our regular staff attended a safety awareness seminar held in the club house on 26 March. Some of the topics that were covered were: worker health and safety awareness, duties of workers, duties of supervisors, employer's duties, the Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS), safe lifting techniques, what to do in an emergency, grounds keeping/equipment safety, personal protective equipment, workplace violence and harassment.

Kyle Hudson and Matt Ireton have both successfully passed their Integrated Pest Management (IPM) accreditation examination.
