M	New Red Tees	Red stakes should be installed to indicate the new red tee locations, as per G. Cooke report. This would allow players to enter scores to help validate/determine those holes for the Red-Gold Hybrid tee combination.	J. France & G. Hobin	Sept. 20	May 1/22	Oct. 15/21	B. Hudson/D. McLeay	C	Red stakes for the new recommended locations will be installed in the spring 2022 prior to the opening of the course. As of Oct. 15 all Red stakes were moved to new locations. A note has been sent out to the membership with new yardages for each hole.
L	Damaged trees.	Several trees have lost branches this season. An example is the tree on the R/H edge of the 17th fairway (at the 150 marker). Can these trees be saved?	J. Hudson	C	Trees will be examined in the fall/winter during the tree cutting program to determine their status and if they can be saved without impacting the safety of players and employees. The Greens staff have been making every effort to save trees around the course by whatever action is necessary and in consultation with an arborist. The MGC Tree Policy states:  "Trees that are a potential hazard or impact safety including sight lines will be trimmed or removed." and  "Every effort will be made to preserve trees of strategic importance to the course layout however those that interfere with play due to overgrowth will be trimmed."
M	The three, non-red tee, recommendations in the G. Cooke report.	There were three recommendations in the G. Cooke report regarding the Gold and White tee boxes on hole 10, the 8th tee box and two evergreen trees on the 4th. Will these recommendations be implemented?	J. McLeay	C	The greens committee supports these three recommendations and proposes that the issue of making the Gold tee on 10 a par 5 be referred to the playing committee. The Playing Committee also supported all recommendations and submitted them to the Board. At the Oct. 12 Board meeting the recommendations were approved.
